-Walk/Trot classes open to those who have never cantered in a show

- Intermediate classes: Beginning canter/lope riders that are learning about leads and building confidence at the canter/lope. Intermediate riding classes are walk/trot canter/lope. Canter/loping may be done briefly, individually, or in small groups, with less expectations than the novice level. No more than 10 horses in ring at a time.

- Novice classes open to those 1-3 years of cantering. No Hand Gallop. No more than 16 horses in ring at a time.

-Advanced classes open to those not qualified for novice or intermediate. No more than 20 horses in ring at a time.

- Novice, Intermediate and Advanced reining patterns determined by Judge. WT provided by Saddle horse in the guidelines.

-All classes count towards point series except for the Mini classes.

-No refunds and Judges decision is final.

-Exhibitors may cross enter into the Western Division and Ranch Division but are expected to follow the Ohio State Rulebook on required attire and turnout for the classes they enter.

- No exhibitor competing in Ranch Riding or Ranch Pleasure classes may cross enter Western Pleasure
